MODERN LANGUAGES

All Arabic (ABT, ARA prefixes), Chinese (CHI, CHT prefixes), all FOL courses, French (FRE, FRT, FRW prefixes), all German (GER, GET, GEW prefixes), all Italian (ITA, ITT, ITW prefixes), all Japanese (JPN, JPT prefixes), Portuguese (POR and PRT prefixes), Russian and Slavic (RUS, RUT, SLL prefixes), and Spanish courses (SPN, SPT, SPW prefixes) count in the major. Those credit hours earned by taking courses to fulfill the modern language requirement (which must be met by all International Affairs majors) cannot be counted toward the major. Students may, however, earn credit toward the major for additional courses in modern languages.

For a departmental concentration in modern languages, students must have a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours in one language beyond the language requirement including a maximum of two courses in culture and/or literature.
