Research and Original Creative Work

Article with B. Ozcan and D. Gore on the living conditions of older women in Turkey published in 2017. Article on immigrant acculturation with A. Guler published in 2018 has led to collaboration with Berry and other Canadian colleagues on applications of our new measure to existing acculturation surveys. A paper with G. Lessan and P. Dinoso Campos on ethnic identities of Hispanic Filipinos is under journal review. A theoretical piece on second demographic transition theory was published at the end of 2018 as the lead chapter in a new edited volume of international research on family change. A major book project involving research teams from a dozen countries, edited by myself and Professor Williams of the University of Washington (and with a chapter we will write together) is scheduled for 2019 publication to document the demographic characteristics of Syrian refugees throughout Europe.
